3 Main goals for NCC students who want to transfer to a 4-year school:

1.) **Demonstrate that you are a solid candidate for a 4-year school.**

- Be academically competitive in your major. Keep your GPA up - it will matter for scholarships and the schools you can get into
- Demonstrate leadership skills: join clubs/organizations, volunteer, be part of the NCC community
- Get work in your field of study through an internship(s)

2.) **Attend NCC in a purposeful way. Consider the courses you take at NCC to transfer a maximum number of credits to 4-year schools.**

- Determine your major by your second semester at NCC

3.) **Create and stick to your transfer plan.**

- Check in with your Future 5 coaches and your NCC

academic advisor throughout your time at NCC

Creating Your Transfer Plan from NCC to a 4-Year School

1.) Research possible 4-year colleges and select the schools where you will apply

To give yourself choices, apply to some safe schools, a handful of middle-of-the-road options and a few dream schools. Consider the following:

- Academic programs available
- College/University campus size, culture
- Entrance requirements: GPA, SAT scores required – acceptance rate and graduation rate
- Tuition / Housing options
- How many students have jobs upon graduation? Within your major?
- How many credits will be accepted from NCC at 4-year school. How long will it take to obtain Bachelor's degree upon transfer?

Consider schools that have Articulation Agreements with NCC.

- **NCC has agreements for Pathway Programs with CSU's (Connecticut State Colleges and Universities: Southern, Central, Western, Eastern) for the following majors:** (more info at: ct.edu/transfer/tickets): Accounting, Art, Biology, Business, Business Administration, Chemistry, Communication, Criminology, Early Childhood Teacher Credential, English, Exercise Science, Finance, French, German, History, Italian, Management, Marketing, Mathematics, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, Social Work, Sociology, Spanish

- Pathway programs ensure there is a clear course sequence of what to take at NCC to so that you will begin as a Junior at a CSCU in your major AND all of your credits from NCC will be accepted by the CSCU you transfer to.
- **UCONN GAP Program:** Maintain a 3.0 GPA (3.3 GPA for Business School) at NCC, apply before you obtain 30 credits and get access to a \$8,000 scholarship (\$2000/ over 4 semesters). See Karla Lara or Pracilya Titus at NCC to apply (West 118).

- **Dual Admission Program:** Program between the Connecticut State University System and the Connecticut Community College System. It is intended for students who identify early their choice of state university along with selection of a major, or program of study for their baccalaureate degree.
 - Students must apply to the Compact Dual Admission Program before completing 15 transferable credits; Complete your associates degree in the appropriate program; Earn a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0. Specific programs may have additional admission requirements.

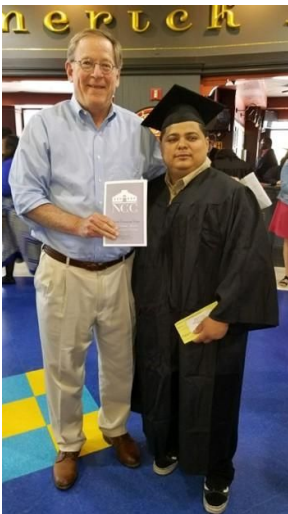
2.) Contact transfer counselors at 4-year colleges that interest you and gather admissions + transfer information. Visit College Campuses

- Utilize Future 5's college partnership program and contacts at 4-year colleges such as: Trinity, Yale, Sacred Heart, Fairfield, Manhattanville, Albertus Magnus, Iona College, and UCONN
- Attend the Transfer Fair at NCC and check transfer visit schedule
- Check out campuses and go on tours - many virtual tours are available.
 - When visiting 4-year schools, bring your NCC transcript. *It is important to understand what courses from NCC will transfer to a 4- year school before you apply. Ask for credit evaluations*

3.) Investigate financial aid possibilities and determine approximate cost to attend 4-year schools

- Ask about part-time student tuition rates
- FAFSA
- Merit-based scholarships at 4-year school for transfer students
- NCC Foundation (LEAP and DREAM scholarships)
- College Green Light, Unigo, Fast Web, College Board
- Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society
- CSCU Foundation Scholarships
- Future 5 scholarship options

Timeline for Transferring to a 4-year School

0-15 Credits:

- Take English, Math, and introductory courses of major(s) you are interested in. Complete any developmental coursework.
- Declare your major during your second semester at NCC. Still unsure? Do informational interviews through NCC Career Services + Future 5 contacts, take career assessment tests, talk to professors
- Meet with your Future 5 coach and NCC academic advisor to determine your path to graduation. Utilize DegreeWorks.
- Attend the NCC Transfer Fair in October and check the monthly visit schedule from admission representatives at NCC.

16-45 Credits:

- Create list of 4-year schools you would like to apply to, and a list of requirements + application deadlines
- Make an appointment to see Orlando Soto (Transfer Counselor) at NCC. East 104; osoto@ncc.commnet.edu
- Visit as many schools as possible
 - Winter and Spring break are good times for college visits
 - Check the Future 5 college tour schedule.
- Continue to communicate with your Future 5 and NCC academic advisor to make sure you are on track to graduation.
 - If you drop a course, fail a class, or want to change your major, let your Future 5 coach know
- Get an internship / job that is related to your field of study. Take an internship course if this is part of your program of study. *Utilize Future 5 contacts for internships/jobs.* Take classes that will prepare you for your major once you transfer to a four-year school. This not only confirms your interest in your major, but also demonstrates to the 4-year school that you are serious about your major, and can succeed at a 4-year school.
- Get involved at NCC. Join student clubs/organizations, take leadership roles



- **Winter break before NCC graduation is an important time to work on applications. Getting the majority of application work completed while**

46 – 60+ Credits:

- Ask professors, employers for recommendation letters
- Write application essays
- Future 5 volunteer coach available for assistance with essays
 - Order official transcripts from your High School and NCC
 - Apply for graduation at NCC
 - Keep studying during your last semester. The college/university will check your final GPA
